By the time you get to the end of this list, you'll know exactly which schools have fantastic need blind admissions policies – all because of the several primary factors listed below for your review.

LIST OF ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The following schools while not totally [tuition free colleges](#), fortunately (and wonderfully!) they do offer “Need Blind Admissions”. This means that if you apply and are accepted to these schools, you will only have to pay for what the college or university determines you can pay. In other words, if you are accepted and fill out your financial aid forms and the college determines you can only pay \$500 dollars (even though it costs \$30,000 to attend), they will award you scholarship and grants to cover the amount you owe - in this case $\$30,000 - \$500 = \$29,500$ is what you would be awarded in scholarships. As for the \$500 most of these schools allow you to take out loans for the amount that you would owe (in this case \$500). So, while these schools are not [tuition free colleges](#), they still provide the option to attend a school that you would normally not be able to afford.
